Our Show & Competition that was held in April was a success, thanks to the hard work of Doug Law, Show Chair and his volunteers.

This year there were a number of programs that were organized by Laurie Wilson-Larson and well attended by new and seasoned carvers. Demonstrations took place at Fort Edmonton and the Ukrainian Village which was organized by Jack Wallace.

I appreciate all the input from Brian Harroun over the years to our executive. He is not letting his name stand. I realize that lots of our long time members have served their time on the executive but we do need some more members to come forward and assist with running this club. I would also like to thank Alex Morrison on the excellent job with the newsletter. He did a fine job until his 'paid' job became much busier and he had to relinquish the reins.

A reminder that next Wednesday the Club will be decorating the tree for the Festival of Trees. Charlotte will also be doing a wood burning demonstration.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Barney Murray reported the club's bank balance as of September 30, 2014 is \$8,818.04.

<u>Memberships</u> - 2015 Membership renewal forms were distributed and there will be an opportunity to renew your membership at the conclusion of the meeting. At the present time, we have 66 members.

<u>Website</u> (Bonnie Budge) - Jean Cloutier and I received a tutorial from Clark Park of Planetcom regarding the Club's website so it could be updated on a regular basis.

We spent over an hour with Clark who had created the website with help from previous club members. We found the set up difficult to navigate. Clark advised us that he does not have the time to re-create pages and expressed frustration in repetitively having to tutor people. This site was created free of charge and goes through the Planetcom server at no cost to the Club. The domain name NAWCA is owned by Roger Plouffe who is the President of Duggan Community Hall.

I believe the website is an important tool for the club to attract new members and to learn about woodcarving. The website should be a "go-to" place for information about club activities and learning, and should be easy to access by the public. We have the opportunity to resolve some of the website issues. Laurie's daughter, Melissa Larson has agreed to help the Club resolve these issues and to create a simple instruction manual for those board members who need to keep it updated. This will be time consuming for Melissa and I feel she should be paid for her services.

I would like to put forward a motion that I be authorized to spend up to \$300 to work on improving our website.

Discussion followed. Doug Bean will talk to Roger Plouffe regarding getting the domain name under the Club's name. The members in attendance approved the motion.
