I was VP for three years under Dave Eisenbeis, then became President for three years. The highlights during my time with the club have been the shows. I have also enjoyed the demonstrations and the club's programming, both as a participant and as a presenter. I recall learning that I was doing a presentation on carving a chain. I thought "Gee, I best carve one before I try to teach others how to do it." I was quite busy just before that program night! I've really enjoyed our participation in the Festival of Trees.

Gord Dunsmuir had spearheaded it for at least one or two years before he handed me the reins. I have cut out quite a few ornaments!

Our 'rent' for the use of Duggan Hall is paid through *sweat equity* (about an \$1800 yearly value). The first year we painted the rink boards and supplied some volunteers for a casino. Mike Leahy gave me some much-appreciated help last year when we rebuilt the north gates including new

puckboard. This year there were only a few boards and a bit of painting. Next year there will be several boards and more painting—we should address this earlier in the year when painting is easier!

My favorite type of carving is faces. Unfortunately, faces are surrounded by ears and hair and necks, which helps explain the large number of unfinished carvings in our house! My favorite wood is butternut, and secondly, 'free'!

<u>Update - Wooden Quilt Project for Canada's 150th Birthday in 2017</u>

Weasel (Gary) Sedgwick has been working very hard organizing our carved quilt project for Canada's 150th birthday in 2017. The project is really rolling along now with many of the tiles being completed and returned!

A huge thanks to Mike Leahy for building the poplar easels to display our finished quilts; Llew Bertsch, who has carved the walnut frame for the first quilt; Fay Hough, who has agreed to work on writing grants; and Bonnie Budge, who has been busy writing up the summary/description of the club and the whole idea behind the quilt.

53+ carvers (79% of the membership) have taken at least one tile. There have been 106 tiles signed out (enough to do 3 quilts if all returned). Here is a sample of the many returned tiles... Wow!



The club is providing the quilt pieces at no charge to our members (thanks to the donation of bass wood by Gary Chanin of *Chanin Hardwoods*), and all members are strongly encouraged to carve one (or more!) of these 5x5" panels. We definitely want the quilts to present the wide range of levels and interests that we have within the club. The more panels we have by the start of 2017, the more quilts we can assemble for the April 2017 completion date. So far, our overall theme of "My Canada" seems to be sparking everybody's imagination...


